OUR POLICIES

1. Guidance Only

We only provide the Islamic guidance and process for those who want to divorce, which is an obligation for all Muslim couples to follow to be Islamically divorced with no issues. We are not a legal or divorce authority.

It is the responsibility of the individuals seeking a divorce to provide accurate and truthful information on the form and any accompanying documents.

Falsification of information may result in legal consequences.

2. Truth and Honesty Policy

Applicants are expected to be truthful and honest throughout the divorce guidance process.

Applicants should fear Allah and understand that honesty is a fundamental Islamic value.

Dishonesty, misrepresentation, or providing false information is strictly prohibited and may result in immediate termination from the divorce guidance service.

The Quranic verse [Quran 3:61] reminds us of the severe consequences of dishonesty: "And whoever commits a sin only earns it against himself. And Allah is ever Knowing and Wise."

Applicants are reminded that lying or being dishonest not only goes against Islamic teachings but also undermines the integrity of the divorce guidance and can harm others seeking genuine connections.

Any inst<mark>ances</mark> of dishonesty identified during the divorce guidance process may result in the disqualification of the applicant and the termination of their participation in the service.

3. Confidentiality Policy

All information provided on the form will be kept strictly confidential, and access will be restricted to authorized individuals involved in the divorce process.

Information will not be disclosed to any third parties without the explicit consent of the individuals involved, except as required by law.

4. Privacy Policy

Personal information collected on the form will be securely stored and used solely for the purpose of processing the divorce and related legal matters.

Measures will be taken to ensure compliance with applicable data protection laws and regulations.

5. Legal Advice Policy

This form and any guidance provided therein do not constitute legal advice.

Individuals are encouraged to seek independent legal advice from a qualified attorney to understand their rights and obligations regarding divorce under the applicable legal jurisdiction in Sierra Leone as the case may be.

6. Fees and Payment Policy

The fee for counselling sessions will be communicated in advance.

Payment is expected to be paid before the session starts, and accepted modes of payment include cash, mobile money, or bank transfer.

Client will still be charged for a full hourly rate even if the time was not fully exhausted. This is as a result of the expenses, time and other administrative cost. Once a client book for an hour, he/she should try exhausting it as that particular hour has only been allocated to him/her.

In the event of cancellation with insufficient notice or no-show, the booking fee is non-refundable.

7. Cancellation and Rescheduling Policy

Clients are requested to provide at least 48 hours' notice for cancellations or rescheduling of sessions.

Late cancellations or missed appointments may be subject to a non-refundable booking fee.

To cancel or reschedule a session, clients are advised to contact the secretary immediately.

8. Code of Ethics Policy

We adhere to a code of ethics, which includes maintaining professionalism, confidentiality, and respect for clients' rights and dignity.
